Four seasons in one day!

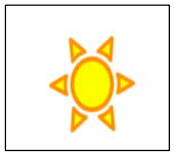
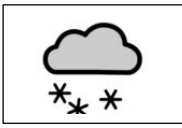


We will describe the weather we can see daily and express our likes and dislikes.

Reading and Writing Skills

- Read a variety of stories and rhymes about the weather and hot and cold places.
- Use paint, pencils and crayons to represent people and objects.
- Begin to write our name with support.
- Strengthen our fingers and develop control by working with small objects to make patterns and pictures.

Number and Shape Skills

- Develop counting skills through number rhymes and songs.
- Say number names in order.
- Name and describe basic shapes – circle, square, triangle and rectangle.
- Use positional language – under, on, next to, behind, in front.

Theme Builder

- Notice daily changes in the weather and describe what we can see.
- Make bird food and bird feeders.
- Answer why and how questions – Why is the ice melting? Why are there shadows on the ground today? How can we help the wildlife around our school?

Other Skills

- Learn the names of our new friends as they join our class.
- Have a go at new activities.
- Remember the routines of our class.
- Use words to express ourselves.
- Try to do up our coats!
