<b>Task 1</b> Week beginning: 07/09/20	Who is in your family? Make a list of as many members of your family as you can including their relationship to you i.e. mum, dad, stepparents, grandmothers, grandfathers, brothers, sisters, uncles, aunts and cousins.
<b>Task 2</b> Week beginning: 14/09/20	Using your list of family members create a family tree. You can include pictures of family members if you would like.
<b>Task 3</b> Week beginning: 21/09/20	Interview a family member about their life and write a non-chronological report. Describe the way they look and their personality. You can include their interests, likes and dislikes, jobs and any interesting stories they may tell you.
<b>Task 4</b> Week beginning: 28/09/20	Using the tone and shading skills we have been practicing in class, draw a pencil portrait of a member of your family.
<b>Task 5</b> Week beginning: 05/10/20	Create a map of your house. Include all the rooms in your house and any outside spaces i.e. front or back gardens, drives and balconies. Think about what symbols you could use to mark features of your house on your map.
<b>Task 6</b> Week beginning: 12/10/20	Families around the world - Look at family life in a different continent and compare, for example, what is life like as part of an Inuit family.
