<b>Year 5</b>	<p>Statutory - Britain's settlement by the Anglo-Saxons and Scots</p> <p>Examples: Roman withdrawal from Britain in c. AD 410</p> <p>Scots invasions from Ireland to north Britain (now Scotland)</p> <p>Anglo-Saxon invasions, settlements and kingdoms: place names and village life Anglo-Saxon art and culture</p> <p>Christian conversion – Canterbury, Iona and Lindisfarne</p>	<p>Statutory - Mayan civilisation c.AD900 (Non-European society that provides contrast with British history)</p>	<p>The Victorians (aspect of British history that extends chronological knowledge beyond 1066)</p>
